<p>Rationale</p>	<p>Law Enforcement officers are required to respond to random acts of extreme violence and to end the violence in the timeliest manner possible.</p> <p>Some of the most extreme acts of violence are referred to as, “Active Shooters” or “Active Killers.” The response to this situation has evolved to an Immediate Intervention model known as, Immediate Response Deployment.</p> <p>In order to accomplish this extremely difficult task Law Enforcement Officers need to be taught the most appropriate response to these incidents.</p> <p>This training is crucial to minimize death and injury to the public, Law Enforcement Officers, and the suspect(s)</p>
<p>Course Objectives</p>	<p>To have the students proficient at the tactics needed to stop the “Active Killers” and to enable the attendees to teach their fellow Officers the tactics required.</p> <p>The use of FX simmunition will be utilized to heighten the officers’ stress level to better align officers to their real world function.</p>
